

These are numbers for Cleveland Clinic's Main Campus:

- # of assaults is down 50% and # of robberies is down 43% from 2014-2015
- # of total arrests was 185 for 2014 and is currently 162 for 2015 YTD (These arrests range from assaults, robbery, burglary, disorderly conduct, criminal trespassing/panhandling, drug possession, weapon possession, auto theft, individuals with warrants, etc.)
- Also important to note, that of the 16 total robberies and assaults in 2014, 8 resulted in arrest.
 - Of the 7 total robberies and assaults in 2015 (YTD) 2 resulted in arrest.

Assaults – are those crimes in which charges are filed and there is clear and deliberate intent to cause harm

Robbery— is defined as theft that involves an actual assault or threatened assault

We define workplace violence as: any act or threat of physical violence, harassment, intimidation, or other threatening disruptive behavior that occurs at the work site. **It ranges from threats and verbal abuse to physical assaults, etc..** It can affect and involve employees, patients and visitors.

We define a domestic dispute as: A situation where two or more people living in the same household, are/were involved in a romantic relationship, or are family, are involved in a **verbal altercation** and police intervention is requested.

We define domestic violence as: A situation where two or more people living in the same household, are/were involved in a romantic relationship, or are family, are involved in a **physical altercation** and police intervention is requested.

Cleveland Clinic has significantly invested in its security/police force and is very vigilant in providing a safe and secure environment for our patients, employees and visitors. Our ability to continue to minimize violent crime is directly related to the:

- Recruitment and selection of police officers and security personnel
- Mission-based orientation and training of all police personnel
- Training of employees in general
- Investment in security
- Focus on crime prevention
- Regular assessment of all security measures where Cleveland Clinic has facilities

Some important safety initiatives in place at Cleveland Clinic hospitals and facilities:

- Police & Security presence – with a focus to detect, deter and respond quickly.
- Police & Security staffing is comprised of Cleveland Clinic Police, Security, as well as local Police.
- We maintain strong relationships and cooperation with the local police departments where Cleveland Clinic facilities are located allowing for even greater comprehensive coverage of our facilities.
- Magnetometers installed in several hospital Emergency Depts. (additional locations are planned for implementation).
- Visitor Management Badging system employed at many facilities
- A strong Workplace Violence Committee and Victim Advocacy program in place

- On-going training for police, security and all Cleveland Clinic employees
- All Cleveland Clinic Caregivers are required to complete on-line Active Shooter training each year.
- A robust crime prevention and community outreach program, providing personal and organizational security awareness information to employees and neighborhood residents.

Background on Cleveland Clinic's Police Department:

- 3rd largest police agency in Northeast Ohio
- Ohio Peace Officer Training Academy (OPOTA) certified.
- CALEA (The Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agency) accredited: less than 10% of state & local departments have achieved this accreditation. **Cleveland Clinic is one of only two hospitals in the nation that is CALEA accredited.**
